Her past successes have included trying three cases over \$100 million and two cases over half a billion dollars. She served as lead trial counsel for one of the largest wage and hour class actions ever to be tried to verdict in California and represented direct purchaser plaintiffs in one of the largest antitrust cases ever certified as a class action—the latter of which Shook highlighted as a growth priority for the firm.

"Jessica is a natural fit for our bench of premier trial lawyers, a strategist who knows her way around the courtroom and a master of pre-litigation work," Shook chair Madeleine McDonough said in a statement. "It will be a seamless transition, one that will benefit our clients."
