

Shook Global Arbitration Chair to Lead Miami International Arbitration Society

A recent study found Miami the second most popular jurisdiction for international arbitration disputes inolving the Americas.

MIAMI (December 13, 2018) Shook Partner Carlos F. Concepción will lead the Miami International Arbitration Society (MIAS), effective January 1, 2019. Concepción, who chairs Shook's Global Arbitration Practice, is known for his strategic approach to navigating disputes with parties and evidence from different legal systems, especially in Latin America, Brazil and the Caribbean. The mission of MIAS is to champion international arbitration and mediation and when appropriate, encourage the use of Miami as the legal jurisdiction for international disputes involving the Americas.

The University of Leicester recently named Miami as the second-most popular U.S. city for international arbitration disputes, second only to New York. The survey found, among other things, that Miami offers easy transportation for business travelers wanting to fly to Latin America with more direct flights from Miami than other cities in the U.S.

"For a whole host of reasons, Miami is positioned to be the ideal venue for global arbitration disputes involving the Americas," stated Concepción.
